

Will of Jane Taylor transcribed SMcW.

Jane Taylor

In the name of God Amen. I Jane Taylor of Cuilderagan (?) in the parish of Kilshalvy, Barony of Corran, Co Sligo, Widow, being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills and testaments heretofore made by me. ? I bequeath my soul to God hoping for his mercies through the merits of my Saviour. Declare ? that my body be decently interred in Tawnagh in the same grave with my husband. I leave and bequeath to my son in law Patrick Graham of Knockalass all my live stock composing some top year old heifers, one cow ane ? two pigs and together with all my household furniture and everything on my land in mime house of which I am possessed at the time of my decease. And I will and bequeath to my grandson John Graham of Knockalass my house premises and farm of land which I hold in Cuilderagan from Col Cooper of Markree Castle. And I hereby nominate constitute and appoint Patrick Graham of Knockalass as sole Executor of this my last will and testament which is written on part of those two pages In witness whereof I have hereunto signed my name and affixed my seal this twenty sixth day of August One thousand Eight hundred and eighty one.
