

Will of Patrick Graham died 1895 (transcribed from facsimile)

5th September 1895

I Patrick Graham of Knockalass Parish of Emlafad, Ballymote, County of Sligo, farmer being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do hereby make publish and declare this my last will and Testament, I give and bequeath to my daughter Anne Five hundred pounds sterling providing she lives in the house with my son Charles whose consent to her marriage at any time will be necessary to entitle her to said fortune of five hundred pounds the question of interest payable to be decided by my son Charles. I give and bequeath to my son John the sum of fifty pounds sterling. I give and bequeath to my son Charles the sum of one hundred and fifty nine pounds sterling together with all monies due me. Also all my cattle houses lands stock in trade And I hereby appoint him that is my son Charles residuary legatee. I also direct that my son Charles be responsible for all my just and burial expenses. I appoint my son Charles as my sole Executor to this my last

will and Testament. In line nine from foot after fifty pounds stg read" free from duty", Patrick Graham signed, sealed published and declared by the said Patrick Graham as and for his last will and Testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence and in presence of each of other have affixed our names hereunto as witnesses on this twenty sixth day of April one thousand and eight hundred and ninety three.
